Reading and Writing

- By the end of the fourth grade, your child should be able to read silently most of the time.
- Make personal connections between the stories and texts they read.
- Write narrative, informational, and persuasive five paragraph essays

Mathematics

- Add, subtract, multiply and divide
- Recognize the relationship between fractions and decimals
- Determine perimeter and area with unit squares
- Use coins and bills to purchase items and make change
- Predict and determine all possible combinations and outcomes
- Identify, compare, and classify shapes based on properties of



- angles (acute is less than 90° , right = 90° , and obtuse is more than 90°)
- Explain how they solved a math problem on their own

Social Studies

- Apply the five themes of geography: location, movement, place, region, and interaction to Pennsylvania and its people
- Examine the importance of the role of ethnic groups and the multiple roles they have played in the development of Pennsylvania
- Trace the history of colonization in Pennsylvania
- Understand the state's social, economic, and political institutions and how they respond to the needs of Pennsylvanians



Science

- Develop skills that will emphasize the five senses while doing science
- Compare results from data collected and create graphs and charts and make predictions and conclusions
- Build an understanding of how waves, wind, water, and ice shape and reshape the Earth's land surface
- Understand basic concepts of magnetism and electricity
- Explain the life cycles of various plants and animals
- Conduct hands-on investigations to discover and understand their world
